Explore the different ways artists sculpt, paint, and draw animals by looking at such works as Milton Avery's *Bucolic Landscape*, Edward Hicks's *Peaceable Kingdom*, and Giacomo Balla's *Dynamism of a Dog on a Leash*, then create your own masterpiece of your favorite animals!

Sunday, November 1, 2009 The Seasons of the Year

Throughout the ages, artists have chosen to paint scenes illustrating the four seasons of the year. By examining Frederick Childe Hassam's *Church at Old Lyme, Connecticut*; Daniel Ridgway Knight's *Springtime*; Paul Gauguin's *The Yellow Christ*; and Claude Monet's *Tow-Path at Argenteuil*, you will see how different artists evoke the seasons, and then create artwork inspired by your favorite season of the year.

Sunday, December 6, 2009 Looking at Art with Your Kids

Contemporary art can be audacious. Oftentimes adults are uncomfortable with or uncertain about viewing and discussing controversial works of art with children. This special *Sunday for art lovers of all ages*, facilitated by Curator of Education Mariann Smith and Program Coordinator Anna Jablonski, will address ways to approach and experience different works of art.

All are welcome to try their drawing skills! Inspired by the special exhibition *In Good Company: Figurative Drawings from the Collection* and other works from our Permanent Collection, you will sketch, scribble, doodle, and draw your own masterpiece.

Sunday, March 7, 2010 Art Conversation

Art can seem complicated, intimidating, and confusing. This Sunday, we will learn how art can be fun! As a group we will have informal discussions in the museum galleries about masterpieces from our Permanent Collection to enrich each other's understanding of art.

Sunday, April 4, 2010 Art in the Third Dimension

Explore the treasures of the Gallery's Permanent Collection that are in the round! We will visit such indoor sculptures as Robert Gober's *The Inverted Sink*, Marisol's *Baby Girl*, Seymour Lipton's *Sea King*, Fernand Léger's *The Walking Flower*, and Alberto Giacometti's *Man Walking* for inspiration before creating our own three-dimensional art.

Sunday, May 2, 2010 Painting Nature

Hills, trees, flowers, landscapes—scenes from nature are everywhere in art! We will explore such paintings as *The Marina Piccola, Capri* by Albert Bierstadt, *Fields of Grain as Seen from Train* by Arthur Dove, *The Coming Storm* by George Inness, *Morning in Provence* by Paul Cézanne, *The Trees* by André Derain, and *Woodland Brook* by Ralph Blakelock and will then paint our own nature-inspired masterworks.
